A148 Issues

At the meeting of the Parish Council held in September, Alexander Cliff and Timothy Young from the NCC Highways Innovations Department attended to provide an update on the traffic and pedestrian surveys carried out in the village over the last few months. Unfortunately, no decision has yet been made as to the actions to be taken following the fatal accident in December 2024. The officers are still building their evidence base and will issue a full report in due course. The Parish Council take the view that a fixed speed camera, lighting at the junctions and a proper crossing are all required, given the speed and volume of traffic.

Several villagers attended the Parish Council meeting and expressed their frustration at the length of time it was taking for action to be taken to reduce speed and improve road safety. A letter has recently been sent to the Police and to the Police and Crime Commissioner asking for details of the criteria required for a fixed speed camera. We are also trying to establish how Hillington, also on the A148 near Kings Lynn, managed to get a fixed speed camera erected in their village.

Concern was also expressed about the state of the pavements in the village where debris is often allowed to accumulate for many months and the verges are overgrown. There is also concern about the narrowness of the pavement in many places. One member of the public has recently been hit by a wing mirror, and there are reports of other near misses. NCC have been advised of these issues and we await their response.

The Funding Group have been looking at the two gravel verges as one enters High Kelling from the direction of Bodham. It is hoped that funding can be obtained to improve these areas. A meeting has recently taken place with officers from NCC to discuss what options might be available.

Bridge Road Safety

The Parish Council are still waiting for information as to when the new signs and road safety improvements will be carried out on Bridge Road. It is anticipated that the work will be carried out before the end of the year. There is concern about the sign that has recently been erected at the entrance to Bridge Road advising that the road is unsuitable for HGVs. Unfortunately, the sign is located at a point where it will not be seen until a vehicle has already turned into Bridge Road.

Village Map and Waymarkers

The parish Council are looking to produce a village map with historical information about the village, with a view to this being displayed in various locations in the village. It is hoped that funding will be available to meet all or part of the cost of this initiative.

Finally, I would like to thank Cllr Maureen Pearman the Vice Chair of the Parish Council for taking the Chair at the September meeting and for providing me with a full update following the meeting. I was unable to attend the meeting because of Covid which is obviously still around.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Tuesday 18th November at 7pm at the Village Hall.

Holt Area Caring Society (HACS) is a local charity whose aim is to enhance the lives of people living in the Holt area by driving people to and from their medical appointments.



Our drivers use their own cars and receive a mileage fee for all journeys. There is no expectation regarding the minimum number of journeys to be undertaken, nor any obligation to do the longer journeys.



Annual Gift Day, Saturday 1st November 2025 10am to 12noon Avenue Road (outside the Village Hall)

The Church of All Saints here in High Kelling is dedicated to the communion of Saints. Support your new evening bus service in High Kelling

We wrote to Sanders Coaches to ask how the new evening bus service was faring. Their operations manager, Kieran Smith, responded as follows . . .

From Sunday 18th May 2025, with funding via Norfolk County Council's Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP), Sanders Coaches introduced a new improved late service on local bus route 44 running between Holt and Sheringham. Journeys from Holt Market Place now run towards Sheringham, Cromer and Norwich at 19:26 and 21:36, plus journeys leaving Norwich back towards Holt at 19:10, 21:40 and 22:40.

Evening bus services require public support on a regular, year-round basis to ensure future viability. It really is a case of 'use it or lose it'. Very often, evening bus services are requested for reasons such as "we could go to the pantomime" – but, of course, in reality, only one use a year does not generate sufficient support.

Perhaps you attend a regular social group in Cromer or Sheringham in the evenings, or you have a local evening job on the coast, to which you usually drive. Hopping on the bus could save you some money, especially if you hold a concessionary bus pass, whilst ensuring there is sufficient support to keep late bus services running. So, what could you do with the new evening bus service?

Cromer Pier Events – The last bus from Cromer at 23:50 gives you plenty of time to see a show at Cromer Pier. There is plenty on through the year to suit all tastes.

Cinemas in Norwich – Stay out late with cinema and a meal, using the last bus from Norwich at 22:40 back home. Buses pick up conveniently at Castle Meadow (right near Vue Cinema) or Tombland (a short walk from ODEON at Riverside or Cinema City of St Andrews Street).

Sheringham Little Theatre – Take a look at the many performances at Sheringham Little Theatre; last buses home are at 23:05 or 00:05 from Station Approach.

Dinner out in Holt, Sheringham, Cromer or Aylsham – If you enjoy visiting our many local pubs or restaurants, consider going by bus. The bus is your 'designated driver', so you could enjoy an extra pint! There are so many pubs and restaurants on our 44/X44 service route that you'll be spoiled for choice.

Regal Movieplex, Cromer – Buses from Cromer will pick you up conveniently at Louden Road, right by the Regal Movieplex. There's plenty of time for an evening viewing, with the last buses home towards Holt departing at 22:44 and 23:44.

Holt Medical Practice Autumn 2025 Flu & COVID Vaccinations

IMPORTANT CHANGES - Flu & COVID Vaccinations

This year, there has been a change as to the age groups eligible for the COVID vaccination. Please see our website for full details (www.holt-practice.nhs.uk)

- FLU vaccination = for patients 65yrs and over and those who are "clinically at risk".
- COVID vaccination = ONLY for patients 75yrs and over and those who are "immunosuppressed".

So just because you are eligible for a flu jab does not mean you are automatically eligible for a COVID vaccine.

The Surgery is unable to give COVID vaccinations to under 18s so eligible children will need to book to have their COVID booster via the National Booking System. We can give flu to eligible children, see below.

JOINT COVID & FLU CLINICS

The following cohorts of patients will be invited to have both the flu and COVID vaccines in a joint clinic, where we will give one vaccine in each arm:

- ALL patients 75 yrs and over; AND
- ALL patients 18 74 yrs who are immunosuppressed.

These JOINT flu and COVID clinics will be held on:

- Saturday 11th October (AM)
- Saturday 18th October (AM)

For all clinics, patients will be offered the earliest available appointment on the date they wish to attend. We are unable to accommodate requests for specific times.

The Government's recommendation is that eligible patients should have BOTH vaccines. Patients can attend these clinics and decline to have one or other of the vaccines, however, will not be holding separate catch-up clinics later.

Care Home and housebound patients will be offered both the flu and COVID vaccinations from 1st of October. These will be given in their homes, and we will contact the patients or the Homes directly to arrange when we will visit.

FLU ONLY ADULT CLINICS

The following patients will be invited to attend flu ONLY clinics:

- ALL patients 65 to 75 yrs old; and
- All 18 64 yr olds who are clinically at risk.

These flu ONLY clinics will be held on:

- Tuesday 14th October (AM)
- Tuesday 21st October (PM)

We ask that patients arrive at their allocated appointment time and wear clothing that allows easy access to the top of their arm to ensure a smooth flowing clinic.

FLU ONLY CHILDRENS' CLINICS

We will contact you to invite the following children to attend special children's flu clinics at the Surgery:

- ALL 2 3yr olds; AND
- 4 17yr olds who are clinically at-risk.

School-aged children (who are not at-risk) will be offered their flu vaccines through their school.

HOW TO BOOK

- Booking opens on Tuesday 16th September. Please do not try to book before.
- You can book:
 - o from the text message link that we send to you (if you have registered your mobile with us) OR
 - by calling us on our Vaccination Booking Line (01263 712461, choose Option 8)
 open Mon-Fri, 2pm 5pm.
- Appointment Times will be staggered at set times to ensure a steady flow.
 Please stick to them.
- **If you wish to decline** both or either vaccination, please contact us via our website or by calling the Vaccination Booking Line (01263 712461, Option 8).




