### From your Parish Council

### **Resurfacing of A148**

The Parish Council was given two days' notice of the night time road closure on the A148 for the road to be resurfaced. This did not give us sufficient time to advise residents through the Parish Chronicle. I am sure that the County Council could



have provided more notice of these works, and I intend to raise the issue with the Highways Authority. By the time this report is published the works should be completed and hopefully not too much inconvenience will have been caused.

### Planning Permission for the former Pineheath Care Home

It appears that the planning application for the conversion of the former care home to 35 dwellings is going to be granted. The developer was required to satisfy NNDC on two issues, namely visibility splays and a contribution towards a pedestrian safety scheme; we have been advised that both elements have been resolved.

I am informed that Norfolk County Council did not have any objection to the proposals. We await details of the proposals for improved road safety. It is my understanding that the developer has been asked to contribute the sum of £20,000 towards improved road safety. This figure was agreed by the District Council without any consultation with the Parish Council, and Parish Cllrs have already expressed concerns about the adequacy of this sum. I mentioned previously that our MP convened a meeting in March with relevant stakeholders and was awaiting reports back from Highways, Norfolk Police and the Police & Crime Commissioner. The Parish Council has asked the MP for details of the feedback and currently awaits a response.

### Works on Bridge Road

The Parish Council was successful in obtaining some funding for works on Bridge Road. This work will include improved signage and village gates. I am pleased to report that the Holt Rugby Club has made a generous donation towards the cost of these works which means that the cost to the Parish Council is modest. We are trying to find out when the works will be carried out and it is hoped that when this work is complete there will be a noticeable reduction in the speed of traffic.

### SAM2

Many people have commented that the SAM2 has been out of action for the last couple of weeks. I am hoping to resolve the issue shortly; the SAM2 will be moved

to a new location in the village and we will start to gather data again. In the meantime, a full traffic survey has been carried out on the A148, and this should capture the information that the SAM2 would otherwise have provided. One of the major issues in High Kelling is the volume of traffic, which means the battery needs to be changed every five days whereas in other areas the batteries last for 14 days or longer.

### **Pollinator Beds**

It is very good to see that the pollinator beds in the village are now producing colour and are attracting bees, butterflies, and other insects. Fortunately, the muntjacs do not appear to have caused too much damage so far. It is also good to see that for a

modest expense the grass verges at Pineheath junction and near the village sign are being kept neat and tidy. A special thanks to Daniel Adams for his hard work. Daniel has also recently cut the grass between the footpath and the cycle track in front of Voewood which can get rather overgrown at this time of year.

### **Parish Council Meeting**

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place at the Village Hall on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2025 at 7pm. Please come along to the meeting if you wish to ask any questions of the Parish Councillors or if you would like to become a Parish Council member.


