From your Parish Council

The last meeting of the Parish Council took place on the 21st July 2026 and the issues agreed and discussed at that meeting can be summarized as follows:



New member

The Parish Council are pleased to welcome Eric Vardy as a new member. Eric was until recently the County Councillor for this area and has previously served as a District Councillor with North Norfolk District Council. We are pleased that Eric has agreed to be co-opted to the Council. His previous experience will be extremely helpful. There remains one further vacancy on the Parish Council.

For Sale signs on the A148

The Parish Council have asked for any For Sale signs on the main road which relate to properties that are not on this road to be removed. Residents should not ask their Estate Agents to place signs on the main road, particularly at the Pinheath Road junction, as a row of For Sale signs looks unsightly and can cause visibility issues for vehicles using this junction.

Digitalisation of Telephones

Some residents have expressed concern about vulnerable residents losing the ability to use their telephones and mobiles in the event of a power cut. Vulnerable residents can register with BT, who should be able to advise on what to do in the event of a power cut. Some residents have been provided with battery packs. We are hoping to provide more detailed advice in a future edition of the Parish Chronicle.

SAM 2 Speed Camera

The information from the SAM 2 device and from the Speed Watch team suggests that overall speed on the A148 during the Summer months has improved and more vehicles are observing the 30mph limit. This may be because of the increased volume of traffic and regular police attendance. The Police are looking into whether they will provide additional support by allowing the trial of a vehicle number plate recognition device to be added to the SAM2 which would display the vehicle registration number as well as recording the speed.

Dog fouling in the village

New signage has been obtained to remind dog owners of their responsibilities in picking up and disposing of dog excrement. There have been issues on both Warren

Road and Avenue Road where some dog owners are failing to pick up. The Parish Council have provided appropriate refuse bins for dog owners and pay for these to be emptied on a regular basis.

Maintenance of street furniture

Many thanks to the three individuals who have repaired and improved the bench at the Pineheath Road junction. They wish to remain anonymous, but I think everyone would agree that they have done a really good job. (See more about this at the conclusion of this article.) The Parish Council are also arranging for the village noticeboards at Pineheath Road and Bridge Road to be repaired and for the 5erspex to be renewed.

Bridge Road

We are still waiting for Highways to install the additional signage on Bridge Road which is designed to slow vehicles down as they approach the village. We are also looking into whether the vegetation in the vicinity of the bridge could be cut back to improve visibility for motorists and pedestrians.

Use of Warren Road

A local resident has expressed concerns over access rights over Warren Road and the status of the concrete road linking Bridge Road to Warren Road. The Parish Council are obtaining information from the Land Registry in the hope of clarifying the situation.

Lighting at the entrance to the Church

The Parish Council have spent some time looking at the provision of lighting at the entrance to the Church from the A148. It is likely to be very expensive to lay cabling from the Church to the A148. A quote has been obtained for using solar panels, but this is also expensive and not guaranteed to work because of the tree canopy. We are now looking at whether it is possible to have a battery-operated light for this location. The Parish Council will also investigate whether any grant funding is available.

Consultation/ Engagement Event

The Parish Council is looking at the possibility of holding such an event at the Village Hall on Tuesday 3rd November at 2pm. We are hoping to arrange for someone from Highways to speak at the meeting and answer questions about safety improvements on the A148. We also hope to have more information to impart on the arrangements for communication issues in the event of a power cut (see above).

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place at the Village Hall on Tuesday 15th September at 7.00pm.

More about the Pineheath Road bench refurbishment . . .

Many villagers have asked about the whereabouts of the bench at the end of Pineheath Road, after it disappeared a few months ago.

The bench was originally installed to celebrate the Diamond Anniversary of the reign of the late Queen Elizabeth II., some 14 years ago. Sitting out in all weathers had sadly taken its toll on its structure and fittings. Three villagers (who wish to remain anonymous) decided to restore the bench back to its original condition, for which over 20 man-hours' work were required.



After thorough cleaning and sanding, five coats of wood preservative were applied, and three new seat-base supports were fitted. The commemorative plaque affixed to the bench was also cleaned, polished and lacquered.

Please feel free to enjoy sitting on this refurbished bench reflecting on how lucky we all are to live in this lovely village.

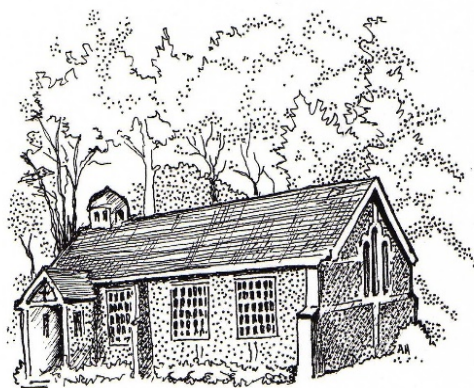

Dear Friends,

Faith matters! Faith not only is “the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen,” giving people of faith comfort and strength, faith also shapes our lives. St Peter’s declaration of faith in Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of the living God, would shape the rest of his life. He would become the rock on which Christ would build his Church and it would eventually cost him his own life.

For those who share Peter’s declaration of faith, it also shapes our lives and has consequences for what we do and say. Faith is expressed in the way we live our lives, the values we espouse, the ethics we embrace, the justice we champion, and the causes we support.

In July this year, members of General Synod met in York and were given the opportunity to debate the plight of Palestinian Christians living in the Holy Land who share the oppression, injustice and suffering of the Palestinian people. Christian communities and their churches have been indiscriminately targeted in the ongoing conflict. Many feel the church in the west has for far too long been silent about the suffering they and other persecuted Christians endure.

Calling on the Church to reject antisemitism, anti-Muslim hostility and all forms of prejudice based on religious affiliation and ethnicity, members of General Synod called on the church to stand in solidarity with Palestinian Christians in non-violent resistance to ongoing occupation of their territory. Synod called on the church of England to acknowledge the suffering of the Palestinian people while continue to pursue the justice, equality, peace and reconciliation in the holy land. Of course, every nation has a right to defend itself, yet people also have a right to live in freedom and peace.

There is always a danger that we remain indifferent to the needs of others, the injustices suffered by others, and the suffering endured by others. Surely, a declaration of faith does not allow us to remain indifferent or silent. Indeed, whether we profess a faith or not, our common humanity calls us to call out acts of inhumanity when we witness them and strive to create a world in which all can dwell in the security of peace and justice. Faith matters!

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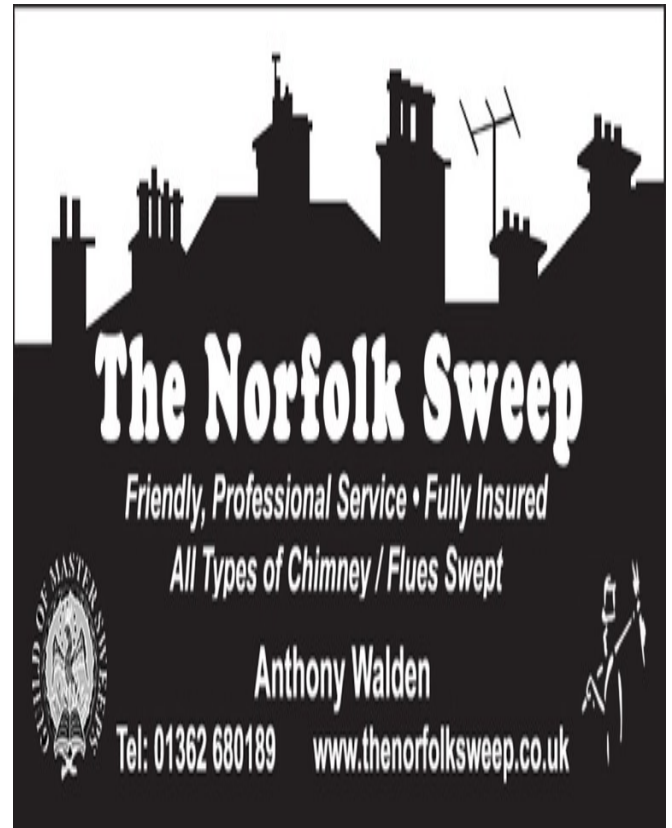
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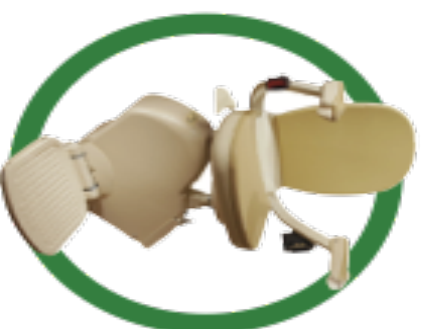
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
