The main news item during the last month has been the application for planning permission relating to the land commonly known as Mattocks Field. An Extraordinary General Meeting took place on the 24th February to discuss the application and, as can be seen from the adjacent photo, it was very well attended. Both Cllr Peter Rutherford, Chair of the Parish Council, and Colin Kemp, Chair of the Village Hall Management Trustees, summarise the concerns about the applications in their respective columns below.

This is something of a bumper issue owing to the several contributions submitted by residents relating to subjects as varied as the North Norfolk Foodbank and Community Fridge at the Treehouse, the activities at Glaven Caring (our local Day Care Centre) and the Holt World Cinema Club. Not forgetting the diligent work undertaken by the Selbrigg Pond Toadwatch Group in ensuring that our local toads get across the road safely as they migrate to their breeding pond and then back again to their home patch. So, grab a cup of tea, put your feet up and enjoy the read.

In his column, Fr Howard gives advance notice of the services leading up to Easter Day at All Saints Church, High Kelling and the Parish Church in Holt . . . which, of course, is the inevitable cue for Carol and Phil Otty to lay on an Easter Cake Day on the 4th April to help restore you after ending your Lenten resolutions.

From your Parish Council

Planning Application Land at Heathfield Road

Following receipt of an application for planning permission in principle for nine new dwellings on land at the end of Heathfield Road, the Parish Council called an Extraordinary Meeting which was held on the 24th February. It was extremely well attended by approximately 80 residents, and after a lengthy debate the Parish Council resolved to send a letter objecting to the application. Many thanks to all who attended and gave their views and opinion as to why this development should not be permitted.



The main issues in connection with this application are that:

- i) it will result in additional vehicles accessing the A148 at either Avenue Road or Pineheath Road, increasing the danger of accidents. Other planning applications for development on Avenue Road have previously been refused on these grounds;
- ii) the construction works would mean heavy construction vehicles regularly using unadopted roads in the village which are unsuitable for such traffic;
- iii) the increased volume of traffic would be a danger to pedestrians, particularly on roads where there are no footpaths; and
- iv) that the permission if granted would almost certainly result in development of adjacent land currently in the same ownership.

The Parish Council have asked the local District Councillors to request that this application be 'called in' so that it is determined by the Planning Committee rather than a Planning Officer.

County Councillor Eric Vardy has been in touch with the Highways Department at NCC and they say:

- i) they are aware that much of the access route is unadopted and unsuitable for increased use, and are not surprised that there are local concerns;
- ii) as this is a permission in principle application, Highways are limited in their consideration of access considerations as these are a technical stage consideration; and

iii) both permission in principle and technical details consent would be needed for there to be planning permission for the development, and even if permission in principle is granted there is no guarantee that technical details consent would also be granted.

Bridge Road

The Parish Council have queried whether Bridge Road is suitable for use for diversions when Kelling Road is closed for roadworks. We asked if a proper risk assessment had been carried out given the problems with the bridge. Unfortunately, the response was unhelpful:

“Bridge Road is the same classification as Kelling Road, a risk assessment is not required as diversion routes must have the same classification of highway or higher.”

Our next meeting is due to be held on 13th March. Apart from our usual agenda items, we shall be updating our plans for rest of the year, reviewing the future of the Seventies Draw Club (see below), as well as commencing our annual review of the Village Hall policies to ensure their suitability, compliance with the laws and requirements of local authorities.



Seventies Draw Club

Planning - Mattocks Field

On behalf of this charity, given that many organised activities are held at the village hall and these are also attended by people from nearby towns and villages, I have made a submission to North Norfolk District Council regarding solely our concerns for hall users' access to and from the village hall during any construction work in the village.

Of course, less than two years ago, at the expense of the charity and others, a stretch of Avenue Road was upgraded with tarmac. This may well need to be made good in due course due to construction traffic.

Ground Lighting Improvements

We are grateful for the positive comments and approval of the external lighting enhancements, which were carried out by Ryan Tinsdale of Connect-els. We believe the external lighting arrangements are now more than adequate.

THE NORTH NORFOLK FOODBANK AND THE COMMUNITY FRIDGE AT THE TREEHOUSE

High Kelling Village Hall hosts a collecting box serving the North Norfolk Foodbank and The Community Fridge at The Treehouse in Holt. The two organisations have a similar but different purpose.

Foodbanks exist to "provide emergency food and practical support to people in their hardest moments". A **food voucher** is required to get help from a food bank. Community organisations such as housing associations, GPs and advice charities can provide a referral for a food voucher, which is then exchanged for a food parcel at the food bank. Donated food bank items such as tinned and packet foods need to be **in date**.

The North Norfolk Foodbank is based at Cromer Methodist Church Hall, West Street, Cromer. <https://northnorfolk.foodbank.org.uk/support-us/donate-food>. Every month a new list of items needed is displayed above the collecting box in the Village Hall. In addition to those items the Foodbank accepts toiletries, household products, and pet food.

The role of Community Fridges is different.

Community Fridges were set up to help prevent food waste and are **available to everyone and are free to use**. Donated items can include unopened **just out of date** tins and packets, including pet food, toiletries, and household products. In 2025 The Community Fridge at The Treehouse prevented 4,084 kilos of donated items (mostly foodstuffs) from being wasted.

The Community Fridge at The Treehouse (<https://www.thetreehousecafe.co.uk>) is based in Charles Road, Holt.

Opening times: Monday to Friday 9am-2pm (Some closures in school holidays).

Local toads and toad patrols



There are several ponds in the local area that are used by toads, as well as frogs and newts, for breeding. Unlike the other two amphibians, toads are faithful to their birth pond. They migrate up to a mile or more at night during February and March back to this pond to breed, then back again afterwards to their 'home patch'.

For some ponds, this makes them particularly vulnerable to road traffic on migration to and from the pond if they have to cross a road, and they often use roads and tracks as it's easier for them to crawl along these than through thick vegetation. Also, male toads will often sit in roads where they can see around them, waiting for a female to grab and hitch a lift to the pond where they can fertilise her eggs.

There are organised toad patrols all over the country where volunteers help toads and other amphibians get safely across roads near breeding ponds – locally these are at Hempstead, Edgefield and Selbrigg. If you might be interested in helping with these and would like to find out more, contacts are:

But you can also help by:

- Being aware of where toad patrols take place during February and March, watch out for warning signs, and drive carefully near these, to help both the toads and the patrollers.
- Develop ‘toad awareness’ if you are driving on rural roads at night, especially in February and March, but also any time over the spring and summer, as toads still come out to hunt at night when migration is over. They’re most likely to be out in mild and wet or damp weather. If you drive reasonably slowly and watch the road carefully, you can see them on the road in the car headlights and hopefully avoid them with your wheels. Not all local ponds with breeding toads have a patrol – please also be especially careful in early spring near Pond Hills, Hempstead and Plumstead Hall Farm up to Baconsthorpe.

Thank you for helping our local toads.


