Editorial Note

That feeling of change is in the air as the holidaymakers wend their way home, the mornings start to get a bit chillier and the evenings draw in. It'll soon be time to start on the leaf-sweeping again, such a large part of life in our 'village in the woods'.

Change too with the arrival of two raised pollinator beds that have been placed at either end of the village and the replacement of the defibrillator at the Village Hall, testament to the work that goes on quietly in the background to promote our quality of life and the amenities we enjoy. But also a reminder that the Parish Council is still short of one Councillor, and the Village Hall Management Committee of several Trustees and Officer posts (Bookings Secretary and Website Manager) to spread the work-load and ensure the continuity of what makes living in High Kelling what it is.

Last month also saw Robin Johnson stand down from being High Kelling's Speed Watch Co-ordinator after no fewer than 15 years, and Alan Mason from being the Seventies Club Administrator for nearly six years. As noted in Fr Howard's piece, the All Saints Church Annual Gift Day takes place on Saturday 26th October. The centenary weekend events that took place back in June were a reminder that the church is not only a place of worship but also (to quote Fr Howard) "a wonderful community space where the wider community can gather". Do please give what you can to ensure its continued financial support.

From which I segue seamlessly to reporting the happy news that Cllr Maureen Pearman, Deputy Chair of the Parish Council, and John Glasspool of Pineheath Road will be having their wedding blessed in All Saints Church by Fr Howard on the 2nd October, followed by a reception at Voewood. I am sure I speak not only for the Parish Council and the Village Hall Management Committee but also the village as a whole in sending them our hearty congratulations and best wishes for a long and happy married life together.

From your Parish Council

Meeting on 17th September

The most recent meeting of the Parish Council took place on 17th September and was attended by County/District Councillor Eric Vardy and District Councillor Martin Batey. We



were informed that the Holway Road Sheringham Roundabout project and the County Council Direct Leader proposals have both been cancelled by the new Labour Government, but the new Waste Disposal Scheme at Sheringham is still likely to proceed. Virgin Media Full Fibre Broadband is likely to be live in the village in early October.

The Parish Council are also hoping to liaise with the Village Hall Trustees about developing the biodiversity agenda further. Anyone wishing to donate any plants or bulbs for the village please contact susan@rutherford.world.

Raised Pollinator Beds



These have now been installed in two locations (by the village sign and the Pineheath Road/A148 junction) and some planting has been carried out, although this will probably need to be supplemented in the Spring. Thank you to Lyn Morgan for donating some of the plants. The maintenance around the beds will continue until the



end of October.

Village Gates on Bridge Road

The Parish Council are hoping to arrange for Village Gates and improved signage on Bridge Road in the hope that this will reduce speeds on that road. A meeting will be taking place with the local Highway Engineer shortly, and we will also use the opportunity to discuss the location of the new pedestrian signs on the A148 and the repair of the west end village gate.

SAM2 Speed Camera

Following our successful grant application, the proposed locations where the camera can be sited have been agreed with Highways and this has meant that we have now been able to order the camera.

Speed Watch

After 15 years of dedication, Robin Johnson has decided the time has come to resign as High Kelling's Community Speed Watch supremo. During his tenure Robin has been out on every single Speed Watch session with two other team members. He will continue as a team member but will no longer have to put out the signs or attend every session. Susan Rutherford has taken over the responsibility for liaison with the police and arranging the weekly rota. A photograph showing a presentation to Robin recognizing his contribution appears on the front cover of this edition.

Cleaning of Drainage Gullies

Following a request by the Parish Council, Highways have recently carried out the cleaning of the gullies on the A148 and part of Pineheath Road, many of which had been blocked for some time and were causing water to pool during periods of heavy rain. Some of the gullies are broken and will need to be replaced, and these have been marked by Highways. There are also some areas on the A148 which have been marked for repair.

Defibrillator Kiosk

A big thanks to Ryan Tinsdale, a village resident and owner of electrical firm Connect, who has recently resolved without charge several electrical issues the defibrillator kiosk was having. Thanks also to the continued efforts of the volunteers who continue to maintain the kiosk and keep the bus shelter clean. Following a suggestion at the Annual Meeting, the Parish Council are looking to install a Village Information Board in the Kiosk with details of the history of High Kelling and signposting local points of interest.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place at the Village Hall on Tuesday 19th November.

I anticipate that we will be discussing a planning application for residential development at the old Pineheath Care Home site. We have been informed that the application has been submitted to North Norfolk District Council and we should have further information in the next couple of weeks.






